What to Bring to Your Appointment:

- Completed 2017 Federal Tax Forms (1040, 1040A or 1040EZ) and all W2 forms for BOTH parent(s) AND student
- Social Security Numbers and Birth Dates for parent(s) AND student
- ** FSA ID** (Username and password) for ONE parent and student *(see next page for instructions)*
- Balance of Cash, Savings and Checking Accounts
- Balance of 529's, CD's, Stocks, Mutual Funds, Money Markets
- List of Colleges/Universities student has or will apply to
- Alien Registration Card (if applicable)

Please note:

In order to assist your family as you file the FAFSA, it is critical to bring the requested documents listed above. If the documents are not provided, we appreciate your understanding we may not be able to assist you at the school.

Helpful Tips For Setting Up Your FSA ID

An FSA ID is comprised of a username **and** a password.

1. Go to fsaid.ed.gov
2. Write down – and store in a safe place – the FSA ID username and password for the student and one parent. These are case-sensitive, so be sure to indicate if the letters are uppercase or lowercase. Do not use any part of your name or date of birth in the password.
3. The first two challenge questions must be chosen from the list of drop-down options. The next two are challenge questions of your choosing. Here are some suggestions for challenge questions you need to create:
 - a. Name of street you grew up on
 - b. Mother's maiden name
 - c. Name of first pet
 - d. Name of high school
 - e. Spouse's first name
4. You will be prompted to verify your email address or FAFSA PIN number by accessing a link sent to your email. This is not necessary to do – you may still use your newly-created FSA ID, however it will take between one and three days to verify the information with the Social Security Administration.
5. Currently, FSA IDs are valid for only 18 months.

Helpful Tips:

1. Apply for one student and one parent FSA ID. The student and parent must list different email addresses when applying for their FSA IDs.
2. Your FSA ID is your permanent identification for Federal Student Aid and will be used for all future FAFSA applications and for Federal Direct Loans, should you choose to borrow.
3. Your FSA ID is tied to your Social Security Number so you cannot simply create a new one if you forget your username and password.
4. Retrieval of forgotten or locked FSA ID information is easiest if you have a verified email address; if possible, use a non-school email address that you will continue to use in the future.
5. There is an option to retrieve your FSA ID via text message. A cell phone number can only be entered into the system once, so must be unique to each FSA ID owner.
